### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As you are aware, COVID-19 cases continue to rise at an alarming rate, and a declaration of emergency and a provincewide Stay-at-Home order is in effect as of Thursday, April 8. This has already been extended from 4 to 6 weeks and scheduled to end on May 20, 2021 (or it could be further extended). We urge all our members to heed the advice of public health officials and their request to continue practising social distancing.

The province's vaccination program continues to roll-out and hopefully our community members who are eligible as of now have taken their first dose. If not, please book your appointment as this will be an important tool to help stop the spread of the virus and allow individuals, families, and workers to safely resume normal life.

In an effort to ensure the world's most vulnerable people have access to the COVID-19 vaccine, OZCF is supporting a nationwide project called Love My Neighbour, a project in partnership with UNICEF Canada. Due to the current restrictions and lockdown measures, the much awaited **Dar-ni Pori curbside** pick up scheduled for April 25 had to be postponed. Disappointing for both the buyers and our community chefs. A little patience as a new date will be announced in due course.

Our Fundraising team is finalizing a **Grand Raffle event** which will be running over a period of time, with multiple draws. Stay tuned for the details which will be sent out soon.

Your Facility Management Committee (FMC) has been busy setting up the **security camera system** at the property. A big Thank You to Meherwan Wadia of Atash Theater Systems and the FMC team in getting the cameras and system set up. Meherwan provided free labour and we are grateful for his generosity. The security system has been in the works for some time and installation had to be pushed back due to the restrictions. But now, all systems are up and running.

The Board is holding the next **AGM on Sunday**, **July 11**<sup>th</sup>, **2021**. Please mark this date in your calendar. We will email the details over the coming weeks.

Finally, as always, we wish Tandarosti to our community. Stay Safe and Stay Well!

### PLACE OF WORSHIP ADVISORY COMMITTEE REPORT

Over the past few months, we have been completing the value engineering exercise to reduce costs. The total building Ground Floor Area (GFA) has been reduced to about 8,155sf, with ground floor area 5,565sf (original 6,200 sf), basement 1,514sf and upper level 1,076 sf (priest home, floor only, unheated and unfinished). The siteworks including outside parking area, asphalt, concrete, sidewalks, lighting, underground piping and electrical infrastructure, landscaping and canopy cover, have been redesigned to reduce costs, in consultation with the town.

We have met several times with the town (the wonders of Zoom!) to finalize the site plan drawings for Site Plan Approval which we are now about to submit. The architectural redesign for SPA is complete and the drawings are now with the engineers to finalize, together with the new revised report submission. These are comprised of hundreds of pages of reports that we are revising to meet our new requirements. We hope to submit to the town in mid-May. They need six weeks for review, then we can apply for the building permit which takes about four to six weeks for review, depending on complexity. Due to covid, these times are extended as staff work from home with limitations.

We have been working closely with a number of interested contractors on a design-build basis to identify where and how we can save costs with the revised building. We have had several meetings with them as well as building materials suppliers and identified various areas where we can save from the original design, while fully maintaining the integrity, durability and magnificence of our Atashkadeh and future Atash-e-Adaran. We have now narrowed the contractor search and are discussing further details with them. We are working closely with our engineering consultants to complete the final revised mechanical, electrical, structural plumbing and landscaping drawings to submit for building permit and final pricing.

As I have indicated previously, pricing of all supplies has become higher due to shortages as a result of Covid and contractors are busily attempting to complete prior projects, working through these un-forecasted long lockdown periods. We are therefore anticipating higher than expected pricing for the building and siteworks.

The past few months have seen much interaction amongst us and government agencies, contractors, suppliers, architect, engineers and we are pleased with the progress. We continue to update the board on progress of the project and will keep the community updated on pricing and timing when we have more concrete information. Through the community's strong support and encouragement, this long process has taught us about patience, frustration and persistence, but above all, the will to march on with unwavering determination to fulfill our dream, with faith and trust in Ahura Mazda's guidance.

May Ahura Mazda always bless our community.





































### YOUTH TALK

### **BASIC FAQ'S ON ZOROASTRIANISM**

(compiled by Ontario Mobeds Advisory Committee (OMAC)

### 36). Over what creations do the Ameshā Spentās Preside?

The Ameshā Spentās were assigned the work of presiding and guarding seven worldly creations:

- I. Ahura Mazda (Hormuzd) Mankind
- II. Vohu Manāh (Bahman) Animal creation
- III. Asha Vahistā (Ardibesht) Fire and all luminaries
- IV. Khshathra Vairaya (Sherevar) Metal & Minerals
- V. Spentā Ārmaity (Aspandard) Earth
- VI. Haurvatāt (Khordad) Water
- VII.Ameretat (Amardad) Plants & Vegetation

#### 37). What is the difference between soul and Fravashi?

According to Zoroastrian theology a man's soul is accountable after death for all the deeds performed in the material world, while Fravashis provide guidance to the soul, like a divine monitor, in the perilous sea of life.

### 38). What is a prayer?

Prayer is a process of communion that allows us to communicate with God!

#### 39). What is the best type of prayer?

The best type of prayer is that which helps one to improve his/her life physically, mentally and spiritually and inspires to serve the surrounding world to the best of one's ability.



### 40). How should true prayers be offered?


True prayers should be offered with devotion, peaceful mind, sincerity of heart and deep yearning for spiritual joy.

### 41). What purpose does prayer serve?

Prayer calms down our mind and heart, provides us with inner strength, self-confidence and leads to enlightenment.

### 42). If the Gāh changes while performing our prayers can we continue praying in the old Gāh?

Ideally, one should complete a ceremony/prayer during the same Gāh. However, if one is close to the end of their prayers and the Gāh changes, the prayers can flow into the next Gāh.
