With a resolute and united voice, the OZCF membership voted unanimously, 211 for and 0 against, to purchase a 10.1 acre parcel of land. Thanks to the community's solid efforts over the past three years, this brings to fruition a long and rewarding search for an ideal property on which to build our place of worship and cultural centre. Let there be no doubt, that this unprecedented 100% support vote, is a milestone for Zoroastrians in Canada and echoed a loud and strong message from the membership for a far sighted approach towards the sustainable welfare of our community. As tears of joy flowed at the meeting, the true philanthropy of the community was reflected when they generously donated over \$150,000 from their hearts within minutes. It was equally encouraging to see a large group of youngsters present and even donating their pocket money to the cause.

As the stunning vote of confidence was displayed, it was moving to watch everybody stand and break out into an emotional crescendo of 'Chaiye Hame Zarathushti', in an expression of true pride and passion towards this community cause.

We will now finalize the details to purchase the property. As presented at the meeting, our financial arrangements include allowances for minor expansion and upgrades to the existing facility as well as annual maintenance costs, in order to make the facility useable for our community soon.

This will fulfill the first part of our vision. With the membership's support and assistance, we can then start to develop the construction plans for the new centre. The board of directors and land committee thank the membership for your patience, financial contributions, moral support and confidence, to allow us to complete the work that we set out to do with the Almighty's blessings.

Let me emphasize that this land belongs to all Zoroastrians, Iranians and Parsis, and their families everywhere in the world. Probably one of the larger parcels of land owned by a Zoroastrian community outside of India, this land will offer Zoroastrians the opportunity to build on our deeply rooted foundations and once again secure our place in the pantheons of great religions.

I would like to take this opportunity to invite my fellow Zoroastrians of the ZSO to participate in the celebration of this new facility which is for all Zoroastrians. I would very much encourage open dialogue on the concept of unity among the two organizations. If we, on both sides, can set aside some of our personal ideologies and refrain from innuendo and false perceptions of each other, then we would certainly be able to make progress for the betterment of our society. Let us unite and embrace our accomplishments together, for our future is much stronger that way. After all, we are all of the same community.

History books will reveal that on this incredible day of June 4, 2005, a group of determined Zoroastrians sent a strong and determined message to the world - and the best is yet to come.

I encourage the membership and Zoroastrians around the world to please donate generously to the construction of the new centre. May Ahura Mazda always bless our community.

### Goodbye Jasavala and Sons - The End of an Era

In 1968, Nargis and Rohinton Jasavala brought their five young children to the United States from Zanzibar. Initially settling in Philadelphia, they soon decided that Canada was the place to be; and in 1972 they moved to Ottawa and finally settled in Toronto in 1974.

When both Rohinton uncle and Nargis aunty found themselves out of work, Rohinton uncle had the brilliant idea to start a catering business, and so, Jasavala & Sons was born. At first the catering was done from their apartment in Mississauga with the help of their children and their children's friends. Every function that was catered was a family affair where everyone helped. Not only did Nargis aunty cater for all the functions in the community but she also offered the service of a weekly menu prepared and delivered to your home. Many bachelors and busy families have been spoiled by Nargis aunty's "bhonna" service. By 1977, the apartment was no longer big enough to cater from so Jasavala & Sons moved to new premises on Scarlet Road. In 1990, Nargis aunty & Rohinton uncle bought their current property where Jasavala & Sons has served our community and all who have come to enjoy the wonderful foods that "Mrs. J" has so skillfully and consistently prepared over the years.

Nargis aunty taught herself to cook at a young age and soon learned that only the best quality ingredients would do. She never measured out recipes but her cooking was always consistent and superb. If anyone asked for "Istu," a well-known Parsi dish, it would taste just as wonderful whether you were eating it for the first time or the hundredth time. Quality and quantity were never compromised because Nargis aunty would always make more than you ordered. It was a point of pride that the food should never run short.

Over the years Nargis aunty and Rohinton uncle have taken lunches for the seniors every other Friday at the Darbe Meher. They have donated lunch for the children attending the Ava Nu Parab as well as made the Daar Ni Pori. They have given back to this community in many ways and we are truly grateful.

On May 15th, 2005 Jasavala & Sons closed its doors and took down the sign. The shop that they so carefully equipped and filled with so much effort was locked for the last time and Nargis aunty and Rohinton uncle can finally take some time to enjoy their grandchildren and relax, which they so richly deserve.

From the Parsi community, we extend a heaping heart full of gratitude to Nargis aunty and Rohinton uncle and wish them a happy and well deserved retirement. The void that they are leaving will take a long time to fill.



### Our Prayers have such Meanings

In the long history of Zoroastrianism, the prayer, Ahuna Vairya, has been regarded as something of a talisman, a very potent charm, capable of producing extraordinary effects. Translations of this prayer vary widely. The following is one of them.

Yatha ahu vairyo atha ratush ashat chit hacha, Vangheush dazda manangho shyaothananam angheush Mazdai xshathremcha Ahurai a yim drigubyo dadat vastarem.

### **English Translation:**

Just as the Lord [ahu] is to be chosen (in accordance with truth), [asha]

So also the judgment [ratush] [is to be chosen] in accordance with truth [asha].

As a result of this good thinking [vohu mano, the comprehension and choosing of asha]

establish the rule [xshathra] of actions stemming from an existence of good thinking

for the (sake of the) Wise One, and for the Lord [ahura] whom they [the divine aspects] established as pastor for the needy-dependents.

### Oxford University gives 1st Place to Zarathustra



### Yasna 28.1 (Bodledian MS J2)

The Avesta is a collection of the sacred texts of ancient Persia belonging to the Zoroastrian religion. They are preserved in two languages, the more ancient, referred to as Zend Avesta in the Avestan language, the oldest attested Iranian language still very closely related to Sanskrit. The younger texts are in Pahlavi, a Middle Iranian language.

The Avestas were collated over several hundred years. The oldest portion, the Gathas are the hymns thought to have been composed by Zoroaster himself. The later portions constitute elaborations of Zoroastrian thinking along with detailed descriptions of ritual practices. The texts were transmitted orally for centuries, with the earliest written fixation known dating to 1278

According to a Parsi legend the full text of the Avesta was burned by Alexander the Great at Ecbatana when he invaded Persia. It was later only partly reconstructed from the memories of Zoroastrian priests. This story is not generally accepted by scholars now, but it is acknowledged that the existing text of the Avesta is a fraction of the full texts that existed in antiquity, before the decline of the Zoroastrian faith.

### June 4th, Extraordinary General Meeting

On June 4th, 2005 an extraordinary general meeting was called to vote on the purchase of a parcel of land to accommodate the new OZCF community center. Our illustrious President explained the process that the board of directors and the land committee went through to look for land and the criteria that were identified to meet the needs of the community. He explained that the land committee had carried out an intensive search over the past three years and had viewed over thirty sites in seven municipalities (Mississauga, Oakville, Etobicoke, Brampton, Milton, Caledon and Halton Hills). The parcel of land had to be at least 5 - 15 acres in size to meet the future needs of the community, be as close as possible to the geographic centre of the membership of the OZCF, and have easy highway and all season access. Existing buildings on the property would be a plus as well as having the ability to build in the future. The property should also be aesthetically pleasing and be in an affordable price range. All of these criteria were met by the parcel of land to be purchased.

The property identified has two existing buildings. One is a house and the other is a four-bay building with a mezzanine floor and attached office. There is ample space for future growth and the property may be accessed by any of the four major highways (QEW, 403, 401, 407). Hydro is already in place. With the land already earmarked for future growth, water and sewers will likely be brought in by the town within the next 5-10 years. Currently there is a useable well and septic tank system in place on the property. The conditions of the offer that were made to the owner, to completely protect the interests of the community, were explained in detail. The offer is conditional, subject to the approval of the membership. The town of Oakville planners and politicians have been consulted and they are very supportive of our project. Under current zoning, the property can be immediately used as a place of worship. Jang Engineer informed the membership of the funds that are currently available for the purchase of this property and further details of the financial position.

At this point the resolution to approve the purchase of the land was read by the secretary, Xerxes Wania, and a vote was taken. It was UNANIMOUS! The membership voted "YES" to purchase the land. A second resolution was then put forward, that the membership would empower the board of directors to arrange for the necessary financing required. Before a vote was taken it was put to the members present that if we all put our hands in our pockets that day we would not need to borrow as much money. An incredible snowball began to roll at that point and the members and their families, Iranians and Parsis, spontaneously stood up and gave cheque after cheque and even our youth (the ones actually classified as youth-not anyone at or under Phil's age) got into the act by collecting cash amongst themselves. In total the members donated over \$150,000. The room was electrified by the positive energy that flowed that day and when the second resolution was voted on, it once again was unanimously a resounding "YES".

It was an extremely emotional moment when those gathered there realized that the dream was actually becoming a reality and that they had been there to witness and be part of this momentous occasion. Even more gratifying was the knowledge that our next generation had taken some ownership of the challenge to raise this new community center. The members burst out in a rousing verse of Chaiye Hume Zarthusti at the end of the meeting which brought tears to many an eye. It was an emotional and electrifying end to a momentous meeting.

Two unanimous approvals and the moving forward towards a dream-it doesn't get much better than that!
