Open House and Jashan at 1187 Burnamthorpe Road, Sunday, September 18, 2005

WOW! It was just fantastic to see car loads of people coming to share in the inauguration of our new property. The day started with an outdoor Jashan ceremony performed by 16 mobeds who were welcomed to the 'tent/ stage' with resounding applause from over 600 people from ages 3 months to 94 years.

The weather was perfect. A soft breeze wafted the fragrance of sukhad-loban through the air along with the vibration of the prayers. During the prayers the neighbouring farmer's goats and sheep walked across the field in a row and it appeared as though the fareshtas were really around, blessing us on this new day.

The following mobeds honoured us with the jashan prayers: Ervads Xerxes Bamji, Farhad Bulsra, Firdosh Bulsara, Freyhan Daruwalla, Kerman Katrak, Darius Kanga, Boman Kotwal, Nozer Kotwal, Noshir Mirza, Tehemton Mirza, Farzad Mulla, Cyrus Panthakee, Jal Panthaky, Hoshang Udwadia, Rishaad Unwalla, Kobad Zarolia.

The jashan ended with an inspiring rendition of 'Oh Canada' sung by Tashan Hira, followed by an emotional 'Chaiye Hame Zarathushti' sung by the entire audience.

The President, Phil Sidhwa welcomed everyone and expressed an invitation to the entire community to use this facility. "This facility is for use by all Zoroastrians, young and old, Parsis and Iranians". He pointed out the large number of children and young adults that were present, as a reflection of the vision and make-up of the OZCF to ensure the success of future Zoroastrian generations in North

This is the largest piece of land owned by any Zoroastrian community in North America. Phil pointed out the boundaries of the property in all directions including the grounds where 220 cars were comfortably parked; and then "up", he said, "the heaven is the limit". He gave particular thanks to Harbans Lama, the real estate agent who first introduced us to this property and arranged for the purchase without charging any fees. Mention was also made of the 5 cyclists who at that moment were participating in a 100 Km Bikeathon to raise money for the Lung Association.

Since August 10th, when we took possession of this beautiful piece of land, an army of volunteers has transformed the house and garage building with new flooring, freshly painted walls, and the finishing touches of a dana ni toran.

The invitation for this open house had said refreshments would be served, and boy was there food! Many members contributed by donating sandwiches, beverages, sev, ravo, dahi ,cake, sweets, etc. Everyone enjoyed the feast in true Zarthusti fashion as Hozi Patel kept us entertained with non-stop music on the electric organ. Many poeple just hung out long after the function was over, youth playing soccer and volleyball, kids plucking fruits from the many fruit trees, and running around the large property, simply enjoying a sense of belonging to this place.

To quote Phil Sidhwa again, "This land is a small sparkling jewel for Zoroastrians of Ontario, but one large ray of hope for Zoroastrians around the world"

Work of Parsi Artist to be Featured in Toronto

When Farhad Nargolwalla left Unionville for Ireland in March 1995, he took two suitcases, a few photographs of his artwork, his ambition and \$2,500. He spent the first six months developing a business plan for a studio, and sold candelabras and small sculptures at craft shows and fairs.

But during 1997-1998, the bills started piling up. His sculptures had not sold. "I was going to lose my home and studio and everything I worked for. I never got to the point of giving up. I always held on a little bit longer." Enter his first big break. Europa hotel showcased an exhibit of his work with a candelabra at every table.

When the exhibit was over, the hotel bought everything and paid about \$10,000. These days, he gets that amount for one painting. He also launched a book called The Inferno in Belfast in October 2004, a book of paintings based on Dante's Inferno.

Next year, he is creating two public sculptures in Cyprus, as well as public art pieces in Tunisia and possibly in Israel. Nargolwalla has a bronze sculpture on display and for sale at the Fred Varley Gallery called Farhad and Shereen, inspired by a Persian love story. 

There are other uses for the in-flight data systems, with AMS saying it collects data for Environment Canada and Star claiming it is working with an air ambulance outfit to create a system that can transmit vital health information from the patient down to the destination hospital in real time. Kapadia, an accountant from India who later worked in Saudi Arabia, got the idea while serving as financial controller of a Saudi group that owned aircrafts."
