It certainly has been an eventful year at the OZCF. We know our readers love seeing pictures! We hope you enjoy this special annual edition of the OZCF Newsletter in colour. Thank you to **Regal Press** for providing us with this very special issue!

AS WE GROW

So much is happening at the OZCF! Over the past year, many improvements have been made and we are anticipating that we will get even busier as we plan not only for social events, but for the growth of our community centre.

LOAN UPDATE

The new Board negotiated with the bank to reduce the monthly loan payment from \$3,600 down to \$1,500 to ensure that we will have sufficient funds in our account to cover the yearly cost of operation (\$75,000). The Board is proud to inform our membership that our outstanding loan of \$136,000 from last July is now brought down to \$95,000.

TABLES AND CHAIRS

We are happy to report that your Board is in the process of replacing the old, torn and some unsafe chairs and tables this Summer.

PATIO COVER

The Board is in the process of obtaining quotes to build a permanent shade over the patio. We have made application to Town of Oakville for their approval. This will help our members to enjoy the outdoors under the hot sun or rainy days. Seniors may be able to do their exercise and yoga in fresh air. The patio cover will also help increase the capacity of our hall for various functions and events. This will be a nice addition to our facility until major development, which may take 8-12 years to build.

PARKING LOT

Our parking lot needs work! In the past we have spent in excess of \$20,000 to cover the parking lot with gravel stones. Every winter due to snow plowing the gravel stones get pushed out of the parking area and the parking area becomes muddy and full of puddles. Instead of spending an estimated cost of \$150,000 dollars to put asphalt in the parking area, which in next 8-10 years may be removed depending on our future planning, we would like to raise approximately \$9,000 to cover the parking lot with asphalt grindings which will compact and harden and will not be pushed away by a snow plough. We are looking for approximately 60 donors to pay \$150. This will raise \$9,000 which will also cover the cost of asphalt grinding, levelling and compacting. If you would please pledge your support in this matter, please send your cheques marked "Parking Lot" to the OZCF.

FACILITY USAGE

Our facility is used extensively for our entertainment, religious, sports and private functions. The main hall can accommodate between 100 –120 people, and in summer, the patio with cover will accommodate over 200 people. Food can be catered!

The first step in that process has been completed and the OZCF has an updated website. Work will continue over the next few months adding more functionality to it. 

Rohinton Mistry up for Booker International

Expert from the Toronto Star on March 29, 2011.

Rohinton Mistry is the lone Canadian in the running for the prestigious Man Booker International Prize, awarded every two years for an author's body of work. The prize, worth more than \$93,000, was won by Alice Munro when it was last presented in 2009. Mistry, 58, an Indian-born writer living in Brampton, has twice been a finalist for the better-known Man Booker Prize, awarded annually for a single novel. He made that shortlist in 1996 for *A Fine Balance*, which had won the Scotiabank Giller Prize the previous year. He also made the Booker shortlist in 2002 for *Family Matters*.

The winner will be announced May 18 during the Sydney Writers' Festival in Australia. Other Canadians who have been in the running for the award include Margaret Atwood, who made the list in both 2005 and 2007, and Michael Ondaatje, considered in 2007. Munro was a finalist in 2007, before winning the next time around.


Zubin Mehta on the Walk of Fame!



HEALTH AWARENESS DAY

On **Sunday, April 3, 2011** the OZCF held an information session at the ZRCC, in collaboration with Dr. Dan Mehta & the Heart & Stroke Foundation. The agenda was to bring awareness to the community about heart & stroke risk factors, warning signs, and prevention. The agenda generated enough interest to pack the ZRCC hall.

Both speakers touched upon the subject from very different angles. Stuart Wilkinson (a volunteer for the Heart and Stroke Foundation, and a stroke survivor), described the warning signs, and the key symptoms that his family used to quickly identify his stroke. Dr. Dan Mehta gave an in-depth description of heart illnesses, and touched upon the preventive aspect: sensible dietary choices & exercise. A Q&A session followed after each speaker, giving the audience an opportunity to ask their own questions.

On the preventive aspect of health, Zubin Dotiwalla, introduced us to Pranayama Yoga, the art and science of deep, rhythmic breathing, that increases lung power. This in turn, energizes the body to function at full capacity and to heal most ailments naturally. The short demo sparked great interest amongst the entire audience.
